## ADDITIONAL COMMENTS

### COMMENTS REGARDING FINDINGS:

Finding #11 – The City of Fort Bragg has used the crews for brush clearing & burning at Otis Johnson Wilderness Park and the Dredge Spoils Site, painting of the historic Fort Building, installing part of the Wastewater Treatment Plant process upgrade, building fences and planting trees at the Guest House Museum, and spreading chips at the Wiggly Giggly Playground.

Finding #28 – The City has purchased lumber from Parlin Fork camp for construction of a retaining wall and repairing stairs at Otis Johnson Wilderness Park and has had the crews construct benches and picnic tables.

Findings #34 and #37 are not within our area so while we agree with the concept we are not actually involved in these projects.

### COMMENTS REGARDING RECOMMENDATION:

Recommendation #2 – The City of Fort Bragg plans to continue utilizing the crews whenever possible.
