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Finding 1: The Board of Supervisors disagrees with this finding to the extent that in order to comply with the State Attorney General Guidelines, any dispensary must be organized as a collective or cooperative.

Finding 2: Planning and zoning ordinances are enacted by action of the Board of Supervisors.

Finding 3: The Treasurer Tax-Collector is able to accurately state the number of licenses issued to date.

Finding 5: The Board of Supervisors admits the finding, but adds the ordinance was never considered for action by the committee.

Findings 7, 8, 9: The Board of Supervisors has no specific information regarding these findings.

Finding 10: A tax initiative has always required a 2/3 vote of the electorate.

Finding 11:

Bullet 1: Unincorporated County only.

Bullet 2: Agree but only because 9.31 was never intended to deal with dispensaries. Public nuisances can still be dealt with through the various county departments.

Bullet 3: The public safety impacts are currently being met, regardless of the existence of dispensaries.

Bullet 4: Agree with the finding.

Recommendations 1 – 11: The Board of Supervisors has formed an ad hoc committee to draft an ordinance for the Board's consideration. It is expected that the committee will return to the Board with its recommendation within six (6) months. All items suggested by the Grand Jury may be considered.

Recommendation 12: This is a policy decision to be made by the Board of Supervisors; it would not come to the Board as a recommendation from the Committee.

Recommendation 13: In accordance with Attorney General Guidelines, all dispensaries must be organized as a collective or cooperative.

Recommendation 14: The Treasurer Tax-Collector has already implemented a system to track licenses issued.
