Required Response from Mendocino County Health & Human Services Agency (HHSA) to the Grand Jury Report "Mendocino County Emergency Services" Dated March 28, 2012 Received May 10, 2012

GRAND JURY FINDINGS

Grand Jury Finding:

#8. The "Gang of Five" authorized individual agency funding for a year to purchase the HAZMAT vehicle. The HAZMAT team is comprised of personnel from County fire agencies and various State agencies (CalFire/Cal Trans/CHP). REHIT operates on an annual grant funding of \$278,000.

HHSA Response to Finding #8:

#8. Disagree Partially

In the 2005 – 2006 Homeland Security (OHS) Grant Cycle the Gang of Five authorized funding for the purchase of the HAZMAT vehicle a.k.a REHIT Rig. The HAZMAT team a.k.a REHIT is comprised of personnel from County Environmental Health, fire agencies, and various state agencies (CalFire/CalTrans/CHP). Annual funding for REHIT includes \$12,000 from city contracts, money recovered from hazmat incident responses, and OHS funding (\$20,000 - \$50,000) for responder training and supplies.

Grand Jury Finding:

#9. REHIT responded to 22 incidents in 2011 and 6 incidents during the first quarter of 2012.

HHSA Response to Finding #9:

#9. Disagree Partially

One correction to finding #9, REHIT has responded to 7 incidents in the first quarter of 2012.

Grand Jury Finding:

#10. Meth lab clean up transportation costs will no longer be financed by the State.

HHSA Response to Finding #10:

#10. Disagree

The State Department of Justice discontinued the clandestine lab evidence collecting and clean up team. Local law enforcement now utilizes REHIT to mitigate chemical hazards found at meth labs. Cal EPA Department of Toxic Substance Control provides and pays for contractor to pick up and dispose of hazardous chemicals found at meth labs.

Grand Jury Finding:

#19. An after-action report of the March 2011 tsunami reported there were several minor glitches involving inter-agency communication regarding road closures along Highway 1.

HHSA Response to #19:

#19. Agree

Grand Jury Finding:

#20. The local EMS Agency is mandated by the State to implement and enforce the provisions of the safety code in order to promote effective and efficient pre-hospital care. This is accomplished by providing certification and accreditation in monitoring training programs and investigating complaints. Funding has been a long-standing problem.

HHSA Response to #20:

#20. Agree

GRAND JURY RECOMMENDATIONS

Recommendation:

#4. The BOS provide sufficient funding to the Emergency Medical Service to perform mandated training, certification, public education, and preparedness of emergency personnel. (finding #20.)

HHSA Response:

#4. The recommendation will not be implemented; it is not within the power of HHSA to direct the Board of Supervisors how to distribute funding.
