- **Tapestry**: Youth Project in Covelo Tuesdays looking at flex time a couple of hrs. each day to address issues as they come up in class rooms. (Similar approach in Laytonville).
- Youth Project new person Amanda Panabantaleon, and will relate well to the youth. Rachel will be full time in January and concerned about the transition
- Doing well at closing the gap
- The direct way to address issues with mental health Providers & Affiliates response to a crisis is through the Grievance Form available on the County Web page.
- FSP referrals for Adult Services can come from Access, Manzanita, Arbor and Hospitality

• Sr. Peer Counseling – not as far as Covelo, but respond to Willits – does not require severe and chronic, more about depression and needs of seniors, depends on volunteers who are seniors and willing to go through the training to be a Sr. Peer Counselor. 4) Recommendations for future MHSA Services

- Direct crisis service through the Innovation Plan is being developed through the Innovation Task Force Committee meetings and anyone is welcome to participate in person or by phone dates are above.
- More public information is needed to educate the public about where to access Mental Health Services
- Need a staff person to facilitate the process of meeting a person in crisis at the hospital or Health Center without involving law enforcement to further their anxiety Example given: Access couldn't come out (even Ukiah)
 - o Access Center will not bridge, they will recommend calling Law Enforcement
- CIT type training: crisis training for community members, and Tribal Police
- Assessing & Managing Suicide Risk Training for front office staff– Robin will check if this is appropriate for Covelo
- Covelo attends the Stakeholders meetings but does not receive what they ask for Covelo Leadership feeling isolated, excluded, and discriminated against
- Communication need Phone tree for ASIST trained community members
- Innovation Idea for phone tree for technical infrastructure for local community experts training & Liaison people willing to provide "respite" safe room.
 - Tie in: mobile training respite
- Need for "Anger Management" training in schools in rural areas (6th, 7th, 8th grades)
 - Multigenerational behavior patterns (drug use, anger management 1:1 vs. group because of different focus needs
 - Competition for resources community level, Agency level, family level, (Food, love, funds, programs, services, time, etc.)
- Update Triple P in Covelo Motherhood/Fatherhood Sacred (through TANF)
- Drop-out rates for Native kids is horrific 8th grade is bigger graduation date
- Peer counseling for seniors and youth needed in Covelo.
- Conference for Leadership needed
- Need for those who are trained in ASIST, identifiable as a network to aide during a crisis to reduce the number of people to be transported (crisis respite)
- Need another ASIST training in Covelo
- WET Mentorship program for Native Americans & Latinos
- Redefine mentoring in rural communities
 - People with life experience getting specialty training grant and stipends for certificate programs "location based", "population based" + Care Management
- Literacy challenges in Covelo
