	• What is not working?	
	 Counseling services through Redwood Community 	
	Services are difficult for students because they are	
	pulled out of class to attend therapy, which causes	
	tension between school/academics and therapeutic	
	services. Students wish that there were more	
	options during the evening to receive counseling	
	services.	
	 There is not and Independent Education Program 	
	offered for students that have aged out of the	
	foster system, but it would be beneficial if there	
	were.	
	 Laytonville Family Resource Center is remote, and 	
	can only help people who come to the center, but	
	does not provide outreach services.
