<p>5.</p>	<p>Consumer & Public Feedback</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● What is working? <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ There is always someone to talk to at the Arbor. ○ The Arbor has great peer providers who are resources to consumers and the community. ○ The Arbor does a good job to help students with their educational goals. ○ The Arbor provides a safe space for students to come to eat, receive therapy, do fun activities, and access their mail. ○ The Arbor does a good job helping youth adjust who are transitioning out of the foster care system. ○ The Long Valley Medical Clinic and Laytonville Family Resource Center offer important services to the area. ● What is not working? <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Counseling services through Redwood Community Services are difficult for students because they are pulled out of class to attend therapy, which causes tension between school/academics and therapeutic services. Students wish that there were more options during the evening to receive counseling services. ○ There is not an Independent Education Program offered for students that have aged out of the foster system, but it would be beneficial if there were. ○ Laytonville Family Resource Center is remote, and can only help people who come to the center, but does not provide outreach services.
