Housing Project – Mke Pallesen	 Summarized the housing decisions that need to be made by the community: One (possibly two) renovated homes or apartments owned and operated by the County, understanding fewest room/units available. Two small new units, made available in 2 locations, understand that these would have a higher operational cost because it is not distributed by the number of units, and so fewer units can be developed, One large unit, in one location, understanding operational costs would be more sustainable, but that this option eliminates the possibility of having housing units in multiple locations. Location preferences: Ukiah, Fort Bragg and Willits Housing for specialty Mental Health clients only, mixed us for all individuals with a percentage of units for MHSA clients, or mixed use but only for those with Special Needs with a percentage of units for MHSA requires it filled with 50% Special Needs to receive funding).
