Findings:

We agree with findings numbered:

1,3,4,5,6,7,8,9,10,11,12,13,14,15,16,17,20,21,22,23,27,28,29,30,31,32

We agree partially with the findings below:

#2 it is true that multiple agencies utilize programs. However, we do not agree that this makes it difficult to determine who is responsible for management and oversight. There is oversight of all programs affected.

#18 We agree that the county provides some prevention services for substance abuse services to the school district. I can not comment on where their other funding comes from.

#24 Alcohol and Drug treatment to youth was integrated into the Childrens system of Care under HHSA integration. AOD treatment services have very limited funding sources.

#25 For FY 2004/2005 Audit of Medical Costs Reports the audit exception was under 1 million. The County is still in the process of appealing that audit.

#26 We agree that youth in Mendocino County are particularly vulnerable to problems with drugs and alcohol. We can not speak to information specific to the school district.

Recommendations

The following recommendations have been implemented:

- #1. The Health and Human Services Agency has historically and will continue to maximize programs for Children and Youth by establishing and maintaining partnerships with community partners such as Redwood Childrens Services, Tapestry and Mendocino County Youth Project
- #3 HHSA will continue to provide support for parenting programs that lead to family reunification through Memorandums of Understanding and contractual relationships with various community partners.
- #4 HHSA will continue to pursue funding for alcohol and drug treatment programs for youth such as PACE, Children System of Care Funding, etc. We will continue to contract with community partners whenever funding is available and it best serves the needs of the clients.

#6 HHSA Mental Health has and will continue to work on all areas of service delivery and administrative functions. It is critical that Mental Health continues to maximize every dollar as allocations from the State continue to shrink. Medi-Cal is always the payer of last resort.

The following recommendation will not be implemented.

#5 This has not been implemented due to budget constraints currently at the Probation Department.
