Staffing Update  - Slowly hiring more staff; continue to support Manzanita while they merge with Tapestry. Manzanita is merging with Tapestry in order to keep their services going.  - Camille reports RQMC is worried about independent housing programs, need to discuss what they are going to do to protect clients that qualify when they get into the housing.  C. RCS – trying to figure out how to provide 24-hour support to housing programs. There are 12 apartments at Orr Creek Commons dedicated for TAY. 	the Sheriff's office to resolve the problem. Trying to support the	
	vulnerable clients there.	
	D. Dr. Goowin had his licensed revoked. Dr. Timme has increased her	
	hours, have a Nurse Practitioner and resident coming on to help as well.	
	Case managers and therapists have been reaching out to every client to	
	make sure they are connected and providing support with any questions	
	or concerns. Clients have also been connecting with other providers to	
	address any concerns.	
	- Dr. Goodwin was providing 100% telehealth services ever since	
	COVID hit. He was never here physically since March of 2020.	
	E. Discussion on why hospitalizations have been going down:	
	- Camille reports RCS opened up Harmony House, which is for	
	conserved clients as a diversion. Madrone House is also being used	
	for crisis diversion. RQMC now leads a multi-agency ACT Team,	
	Assertive Community treatment process which includes all	
	agencies meeting every day at 9am where adult agencies get	
	together and triage the highest most acute clients of the day. That	
	has been very helpful in hospitalization rates going down.	
	- RQMC took over adult services in July of 2016. RCS is opening	
	up a co-located facility (mental health rehab center with psychiatry	
	and WPC services) that is semi secure in a protected space for 16	
	beds. The clinic will contract with BHRS. They are looking into	
	street medicine and a residency program to provide primary care.	
	This facility will be available to clients who are conserved or need	
	longer term care and will be Medi-Cal certified.

	Mendonoma completes community health needs assessments to	
	determine community needs and barriers. The top 3 survey	
	responses for their recent assessment on what barriers people face	
	when trying to overcome an addiction were: availability of	
	addiction services, availability of mental health services, and not	
	ready to receive help. In the South Coast, there were 28 client	
	referrals to addiction treatment services in 2021.

	personal stories of community members who have overcome
