

Water Utility

Nature has given the City of Ukiah a high-quality abundant supply of water. The City of Ukiah's primary water source is the underflow from the Russian River which is classified as Ground Water under Direct Influence for Surface Water. There are four ground water sources located at various points within the City Limits. These sources exceed the needs of both winter and summer demand serving over 7,000 residential and commercial connections with over 90 miles of water main.

The City has a broad portfolio of water rights which allow the City to shift sources of water as needed.

- Pre-1914 Appropriative Right to divert approximately 2,000 acre-feet annually from the Russian River
- 1954 Appropriative Right to divert approximately 14,480 acre-feet annually from the Russian River
- Capability to divert approximately 4,000 acre-feet of groundwater in the Ukiah subbasin
- Contract with RRFC for 800 acre-feet annually

As recent experience in 2014-2015, as the driest year on record demonstrates, the City has sufficient water available to meet current and future needs, regardless of water year type or hydrology, of areas well beyond the existing City limits. The City or its processor in interest has been supplying water to its residents since the later 1800's.

Maintenance and Operations

The highly skilled staff of water operations maintain the water distribution system to ensure delivery of clean and safe drinking water with a minimum or no interruption to our customers. Staff monitor demand within the system and matches the output of the sources to meet the demand. A Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition (SCADA) system allows staff to effectively operate and troubleshoot the City's water distribution system by monitoring all pumps, pump stations, and reservoir parameters remotely.

Recycled Water

The Recycled Water System includes nearly eight miles of pipeline, a 66-million-gallon water storage reservoir, upgraded treatment facilities and improved water and wastewater infrastructure on Oak Manor Drive. This allows the City to serve approximately 325 million gallons of water to farmers, parks, and schools.

As of 2020, the City has completed the first three phases of this project which provide an additional 1,000-

acre feet per year of water supply to the Ukiah Valley. Phase 4, the final phase, is scheduled for construction in 2021 and will provide an additional 400-acre feet per year.


The recycled water project known as the "purple pipe project" provides numerous benefits to our community including promoting a vibrant agricultural region, reducing diversions from the Russian River, assisting in conformation to State conservation objectives and improving environmental habitat by providing an alternative source for frost protection.

Wastewater

Water that goes down your shower, toilet and sink drain enters our wastewater collection system. Over 93 miles of



underground pipes bring this wastewater from homes, businesses, and industry located within the City of Ukiah to the wastewater treatment plant.



The majority of our wastewater runs by gravity through a series of wastewater pipes to the Plant. The remainder of the wastewater, due to elevations that will not allow for gravity flow, must be lifted (pumped) to a location through force (pressurized) mains in the wastewater system that will allow the wastewater to return to a gravity wastewater main.

The Waste Water Treatment Plant underwent a three year, \$56.5M improvement project that was completed in 2009. This plant will insure continued compliance with permit requirements and meet future demand growth.

Maintenance and Operations

The recycled water and wastewater system operators are responsible for nearly 8 miles of recycled water, 93 miles of sewer pipe, and 3 wastewater lift stations. Maintenance includes testing, cleaning, leak repair, operational emergency response, general construction, and more.

Waste Water Treatment Plant Operations

The Waste Water Treatment Plant, operational since 1958, serves the City of Ukiah and the Ukiah Valley Sanitation District. It has a current treatment capacity of 2.8 million gallons per day (MGD) of dry weather flow and 20 MGD of peak wet weather flow. Primary treatment removes floating material, oils and greases, sand and silt and organic solids heavy enough to settle in water. Secondary treatment biologically removes most of the suspended and dissolved organic material.





Treatment steps are grit removal, primary sedimentation, secondary treatment (trickling filters), secondary sedimentation, final clarification (advanced waste water

treatment facility), sludge digestion (digesters), disinfection, dechlorination, and effluent discharge to the percolation ponds.

Water and Sewer Field Operations

Water and Sewer personnel are responsible for the operation and maintenance of the City of Ukiah's water distribution system and the City's sewer collection system that includes the Ukiah Valley Sanitation District. Crews respond to service calls for water mains, water services, fire hydrants, and water valves. They also respond to blockage problems concerning the sewer collection system and house service laterals from the main to the sewer line. Collection system facilities are serviced on a routine basis or as necessary.

Residential Services

Garbage Collection

- Cart: Gray lid
- Sizes: 20, 32, 64 or 96 gallon carts
- Frequency: Weekly
- Material: Non-recyclable items accepted by the landfill

Carts need to be placed at curb or road edge at least 3 feet apart by 5:00am on your collection day. Please position carts to open towards the street and keep them free of neighboring or overhead obstacles. All material must fit inside cart and lid must close. Over-filled or contaminated carts may not be picked up and/or may result in extra charges.

Recycling Collection

The Ukiah Transfer Station and Recycling Center operates as a location for the deposit of municipal solid waste (garbage) as well as a number of other household and commercial materials that are recycled. When loads of mixed waste are received, they are sorted to the maximum extent feasible to extract recyclables and increase diversion from landfilling.

Materials accepted at no charge include:

Materials accepted for a fee include:

All loads of 5 cubic yards or more are weighed and charged by the ton. Discounts are available for separated clean loads of wood and green waste as well as segregated loads of construction and demolition material.


The department is organized into three divisions which are overseen by the Police Captain who is second-in command. The Operations and Administrative Divisions are commanded by Lieutenants, and the Communitcations and Records Division in supervised by a civilian manager.

Our Communications Center handles all 9-1-1 and non-emergency calls for the City of Ukiah and City of Fort Bragg Police Departments, provides after-hours dispatching services for Electric, Water, Wastewater and other City of Ukiah services, and makes emergency notifications to the community.

The Police Department has continued to maintain and build its relationships with community and county agencies along with various supportive service providers. We have sustained our memberships on the Continuum of Care Board, RCS Homeless Services Community Center, Ford Street Project, Mendocino County Youth Project, and the Boys and Girls Club. We firmly believe these community engagements and partnerships are key in reducing crime in our neighborhoods and addressing communty concerns. We have furthered our partnership with Mendocino County's Whole Person Care program to establish a pilot Homeless Outreach Team and continue to develop this program.

Adventist Health Uklah Valley offers 24-hour emergency services. Whenever illness or injury strikes, you can count on us for fast and professional care.

Opened in October 2018, our 14,700-square foot ED has 19 private treatment rooms and two trauma rooms equipped like mini-operating rooms. Patient flow has been carefully designed so patients brought in by ambulance or helicopter are received through a separate entrance from the public walk-in and drop-off entrance.



For patients who require hospitalization in the ICU, eight critical care rooms are equipped with state-of-the-art technology, natural lighting, and accommodations for loved ones at the bedside. Each ICU room is also equipped with its own temperature control systems to provide for individual control of temperature for the comfort of our patients.

Consolidated Fire Services

Fire safety services are an important part of our community but they require sizable investments in equipment and personnel. Currently the City of Ukiah Fire Department is working with the Ukiah Valley Fire District in an effort to consolidate overhead for the two organizations while maintaining comprehensive coverage for both the City and surrounding valley.

The goal for this cooperative effort is to evolve into a governing and financial model providing for the two departments to work as one. The two groups working together are now referred to as the Ukiah Valley Fire Authority (UVFA).

Project Synopsis as of April 2015

In an effort to make fire service for the Ukiah Valley as efficient as possible, two local agencies, the City of Ukiah and the Ukiah Valley Fire Department, have been exploring the possibility of combining efforts as they once did, about 20 years ago. After all, both agencies have the same goals—to protect—the same general jurisdiction. On major calls, both agencies respond and support each other through what is referred to as an auto aid agreement. It seems to make sense to eliminate duplications where possible.

What's Been Done to Date

- The City and District entered a two-year interim operating agreement to create a single administration and combined fire department, known informally as the Ukiah Valley Fire Authority. This agreement was extended to June 30, 2016 at the June 3, 2015 City Council meeting.
- Each agency has retained its own personnel and equipment ownership; a Fire Chief is shared, as are two coordinated fire stations serving the City and the District. All employees are supervised by the Fire Chief, and the City has added money to the District's budget to equalize pay rates.

Prior to entering into the interim agreement, both the City and District acknowledged that some form of contract and/or joint powers agreement (JPA) would need to be devised for a long-term relationship between the two agencies. One of the options explored was formation of a single fire district including the territory of the Ukiah Valley Fire District and City of Ukiah combined.

The Findings after One Year

At a joint meeting of the Ukiah City Council and Ukiah Valley Fire District Board held March 10, findings from the study exploring the single district option indicated that this option would not be possible, due to a number of factors. The presentation can be found on the City of Ukiah website if you would like to see it firsthand.

- The Local Area Formation Commission (LAFCO), which authorizes boundary changes and annexations, must approve of the formation of a single district; the report revealed that neither the City nor the District could meet LAFCO requirements for a single district.
- Currently, the District's revenue sources do not appear adequate to meet future cost increases for services. Neither partner is in the position to support the other, as the study showed. The City is not in a position to allocate a significantly larger share of its general fund to make up for shortfalls in revenue from the District. The City of Ukiah has struggled to balance its general fund for the last seven years. It may well face significant additional deficits in the future. Substantial general fund cuts have been made since 2008, including permanent wage cuts for all employees of the city.

Looking Forward

The independent analysis of the agencies reveals that, for now, the best approach is for the employees to remain on the payroll of their current employer rather than being employed by a fully merged JPA.

For a successful merger, both the City and the District must have equal long-term fiscal stability, and agree upon both governing and contract methods that will provide for a sustainable relationship. The report included measurements and options that will be discussed as the two groups continue to work together. Each agency has selected an Ad/Hoc committee to work on these issues beginning April of 2015.
