

Date: February 23, 2023 To: Physicians and Laboratory Directors From: Public Health Nursing-Communicable Disease and Health Officers Subject: Syphilis Confirmatory Testing and Reporting

California is experiencing an increase in the number of reported syphilis cases. Our main concern is delay in patient care and investigative consultation. Our local health department is taking a high priority with Syphilis cases that a provider may suspect based on symptoms or presentation; even before testing is complete. We would like to provide assistance in streamlining the process for providers.

CDPH requires these tests for Syphilis: A screening/nontreponemal test (RPR or VDRL) <u>with reflex to titer</u> should always be ordered <u>and</u> a confirmatory/treponemal test (TPPA, FTA-Abs or MHA-TP).

We ask laboratory directors to also inform physicians that this option is available at your laboratories. The tests above are essential to case investigation per CDPH. We are contracted with Solano County Public Health Lab if your facility does not have the option of RPR with reflex to titer and TPPA. We can send their lab requisition if needed. **If you suspect a possible case of syphilis, please call us at 707-272-8035.**

Syphilis is to be reported within one working day to Public Health.

Fax us at 707-472-2639 the Confidential Morbidity Report (CMR) for Syphilis and the last note of the patient's visit of the provider who ordered the tests. This will help us greatly with investigation and consulting efficiently with the ordering provider when the tests are complete and available.
