



People arriving in the United States as part of Uniting for Ukraine must be tested for tuberculosis (TB).

Who should be tested?



All people two years of age or older will need to be tested for TB by getting an interferon-gamma release assay (IGRA) test within 90 days after arrival to the United States. An IGRA is a blood test to tell if a person has been infected with TB germs.

Contact your local health department to find out how to get tested.

A Public Health Nurse will provide you assistance to make an appointment to see a medical provider at a clinic for testing within 1 to 2 business days of your call. How much does testing cost?



Ask the Public Health Nurse. Families who are in the U4U program in this county appear to have access to care with Medi-Cal and Partnership to help cover cost. The nurse can help you check with the clinic to make sure your Medi-Cal and Partnership is active.
