Dear Coastal Commissioners,

As a resident of the coastal strip between Ft Bragg & Hwy 128 since the early '70's, I am concerned about many aspects of the installation of poles & aerial fiberoptic cables along the Navarro Ridge Road. Please consider a few of them, below.

I object to the visual encroachment on a viewshed unique to this stretch of coastline in an area designated "highly scenic."

I am not satisfied that impacts on the local ecosystem, including nonhuman lives, have been fully addressed.

The poles & cables present a collision hazard on the narrow, winding Navarro Ridge Road, which is not always maintained to standards. Strong winds & heavy rainfall could predictably bring them down. In dry times, fallen power lines are a fire hazard. I question that undergrounding the lines ---as in more populated/higher-income areas--- was not seriously considered.

I am not satisfied that this project has advanced to its current state with adequate input from all stakeholders; "railroading" comes to mind.

I feel it is imperative that the Coastal Commissioners & the Mendocino County officials be vigilant, courageous, transparent, & timely in their communications with all involved entities---especially the public.

I urge you to deny CDP 2021-0051.
