A person with a history of criminal violent behavior is expected to be released from jail soon. This update is part of our ongoing commitment to community safety and awareness.

Name of Individual: Angel Miller Expected Release Date: Friday, Apr 12, 2024 Miller is a convicted sex offender.

At a recent court hearing, Miller was given a stay away order between 500 N. State and 500 S. State. He then asked if he could go to the Dora Street area of Ukiah, which was not denied by the court.
