

**DISTRICT ATTORNEY AND ELECTED CITY ATTORNEY
ANNUAL REPORT OF HATE CRIME CASES**

BCIA 6 (rev. 12/11)

**January through December 2011
(California Penal Code Sections 13020, 13023, and 422.55)**

California Penal Code section 13023 provides the statutory authority for the Attorney General to collect hate crime data from law enforcement agencies. Penal Code section 422.55 defines a hate crime as a criminal act committed, in whole or in part, because of one or more of the following actual or perceived characteristics of the victim: disability, gender, nationality, race/ethnicity, religion, sexual orientation, association with a person or group with one or more of these actual or perceived characteristics.

There were **no** hate crime cases referred to or initiated by the district or elected city attorney's office during 2011 (check box if no hate crime cases referred).
